Anatomic Parts of a Hernia

Hernial opening or ring (Causes):

Accidental rupture of the abdominal wall Persistent prenatal opening (i.e., the umbilicus)

Hernial sac:

Tissue layers:

- Skin
- Limited number of muscle fibers
- -Fibrous tissue
- -Parietal peritoneum: The peritoneal layer may be absent in certain ventral abdominal hernias because of a rupture. Some authors con ne the term sac to the peritoneal layer when present.

Hernial contents:

- -Loop of intestine (enterocele) Omentum (omentocele)
- -Stomach (gastrocele)
- -Urinary bladder (vesicocele)
