CLINICAL SIGNS OF EQUINE COLIC

- Pawing repeatedly with the forelimb
- Looking back at the flank region
- Curling the upper lip and arching the neck
- Repeatedly raising the rear leg or kicking at the abdomen
- Lying down
- Rolling from side to side
- Sweating and increased respiratory rate
- Stretching out as if to urinate
- Straining to defecate
- Distention of the abdomen
- Loss of appetite
- Depression
- Decreased number of bowel movements
- Elevated pulse rate
