

Routine care, nursing and inspection

Sutures should be removed on day 10 after the operation.

A self-retaining teat tube, such as a Larson's teat tube, can be inserted for approximately 1 week. Remove the cap of the tuben to permit drainage from the quarter in focus, while the other quarters are being milked. Do not hand-milk the teat. Regular drainage of the teat is necessary so that pressure is not placed on the sutures.



Intramammary antibiotics and systemic antibiotics must be administered.

- The client should monitor the animal.
- Any abnormalities like pus/discoloration/smell around the incision site should reported to the veterinarian.
