

Procedure:

- Incision of the skin and suturing of the lower eyelids as described for enucleation
- Dissect everything, including the rectus muscles, away from the bony orbit.
- Transect the optic nerve and retrobulbar muscle as close to the bony orbit as possible
- Using non-absorbable suture material, close the skin incision.
- Using interrupted sutures in the medial portion may enable drainage but may also be at risk of infection. Even though there is risk of infection with drainage, it is necessary.
- Using a trampoline suture will provide a better final cosmetic appearance.
